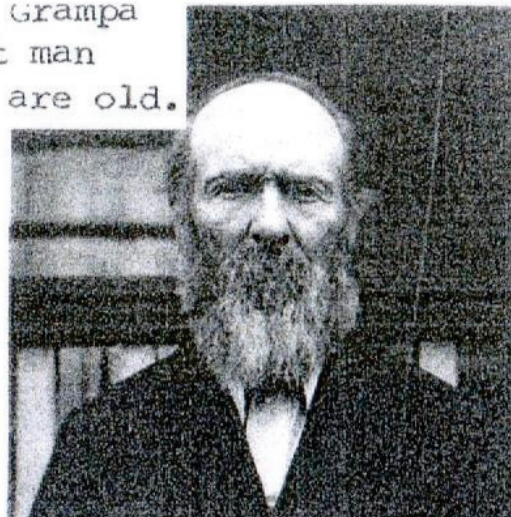

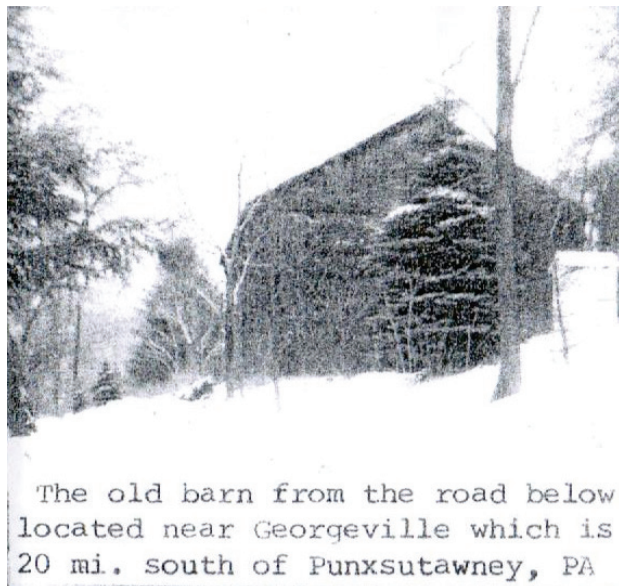

This map shows J. Row just west of Marion Center; it shows J. M. Hazlett just north of Georgeville. The distance from Marion Center to Georgeville is about six miles.

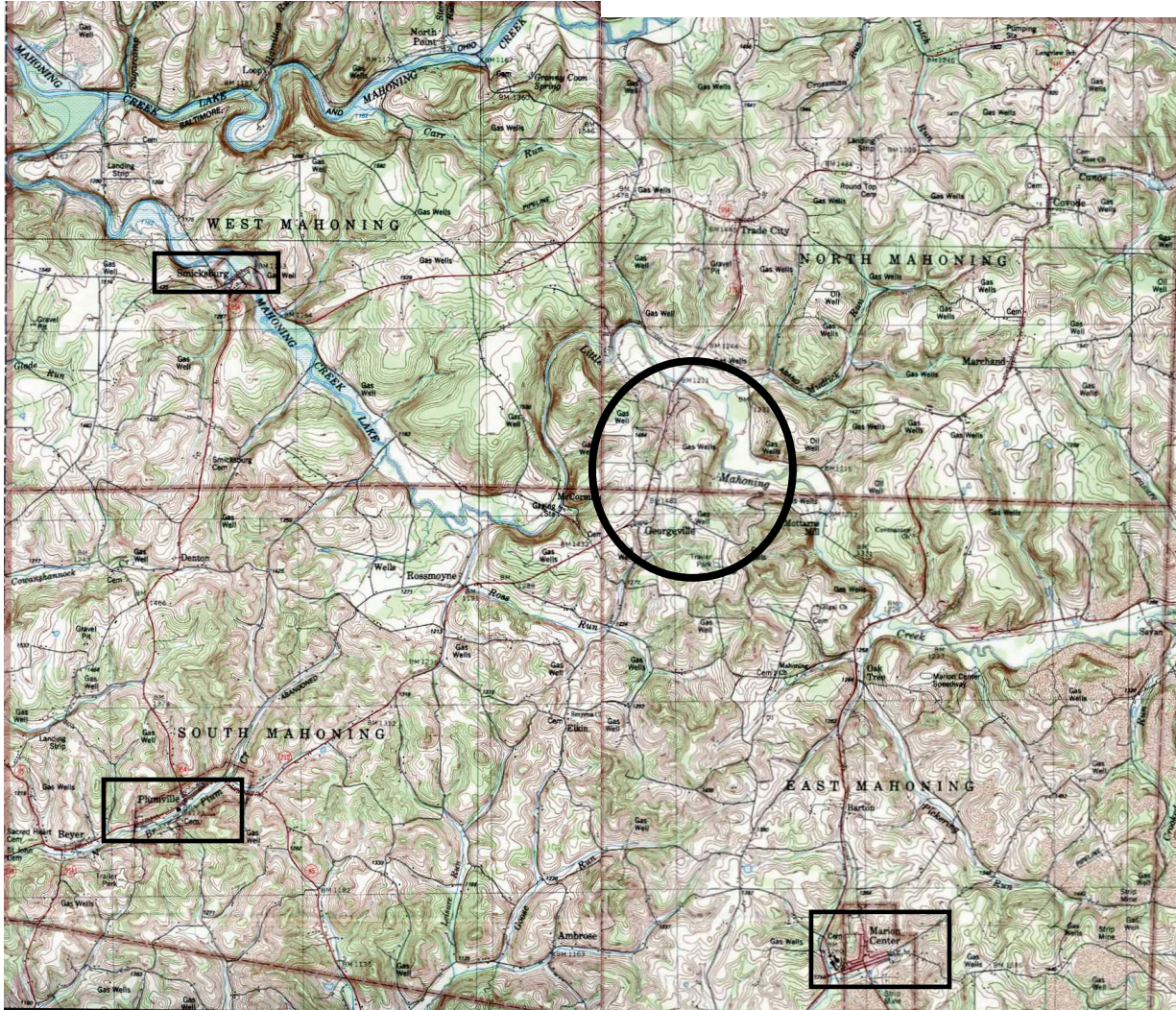

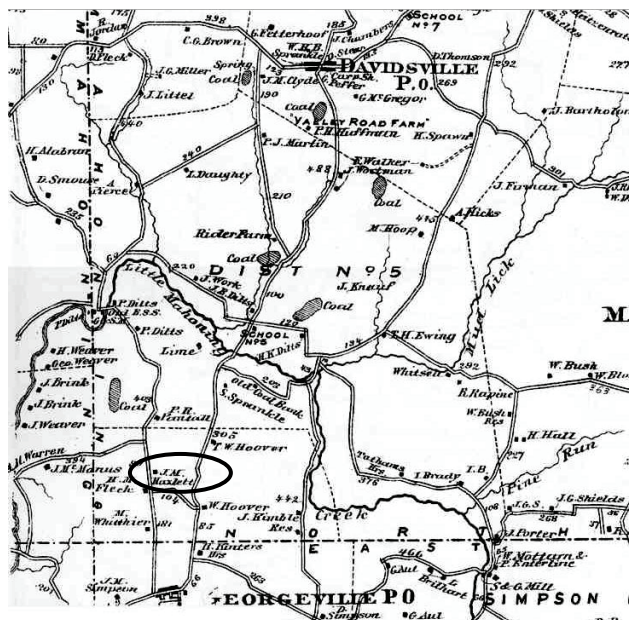

### ZELDA HAZLETT BUTLER

Zelda was a sister to AT's first wife (Katie Laroue) and to Aunt Floie. Here are pictures of Zelda (left) and Floie (right) marked with their names on the back. These are "matching pictures taken at the same place (Pittsburgh) by the same photographer (Kaufmann's)—and thus, arguably, taken at the same time.



Zelda was born in 1878. She married George Butler in 1897 (age 19). They had two children: Ethel (1897) and Dorothy (1900). George died in 1919 when Zelda was 41.

Zelda's mother (Amanda Turner) died April 19, 1920.

In the 1920 census, Zelda (43) was listed as the head of the household living in Oakland Township in Venango County. She was listed as being a farmer; Edward Baker (52) was listed as the hired hand.

In the 1930 census, Zelda was listed as living at 33 Venango Street with her daughter, Dorothy.

Note that 33 Venango St. is next door to 29 Venango St.: the home where Eileen lived with Aunt Floie and Ellery. Aunt Floie was listed as a sales lady: retail grocery store. Zelda was listed as a sales lady: retail dry goods.

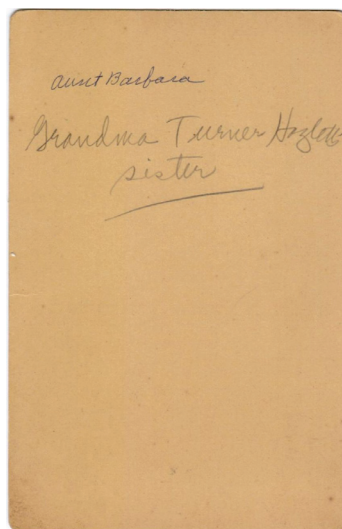
Franklin: Left: Aunt Floie's house (29 Venango St). Right: Aunt Zelda's house (33 Venango St.).

Right: If these kids are Dorothy and Ethel and if Dorothy is four then the date is 1904.

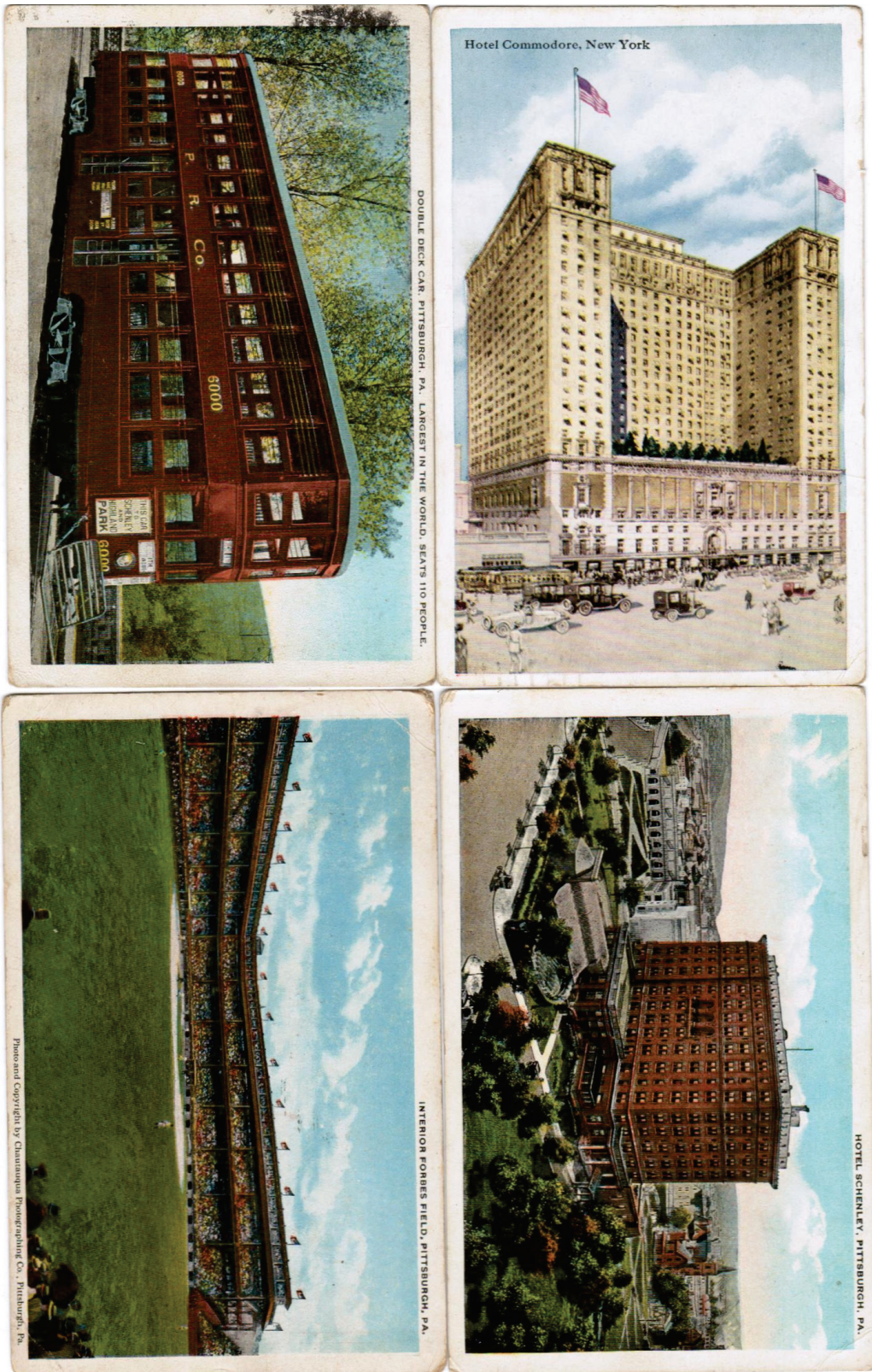

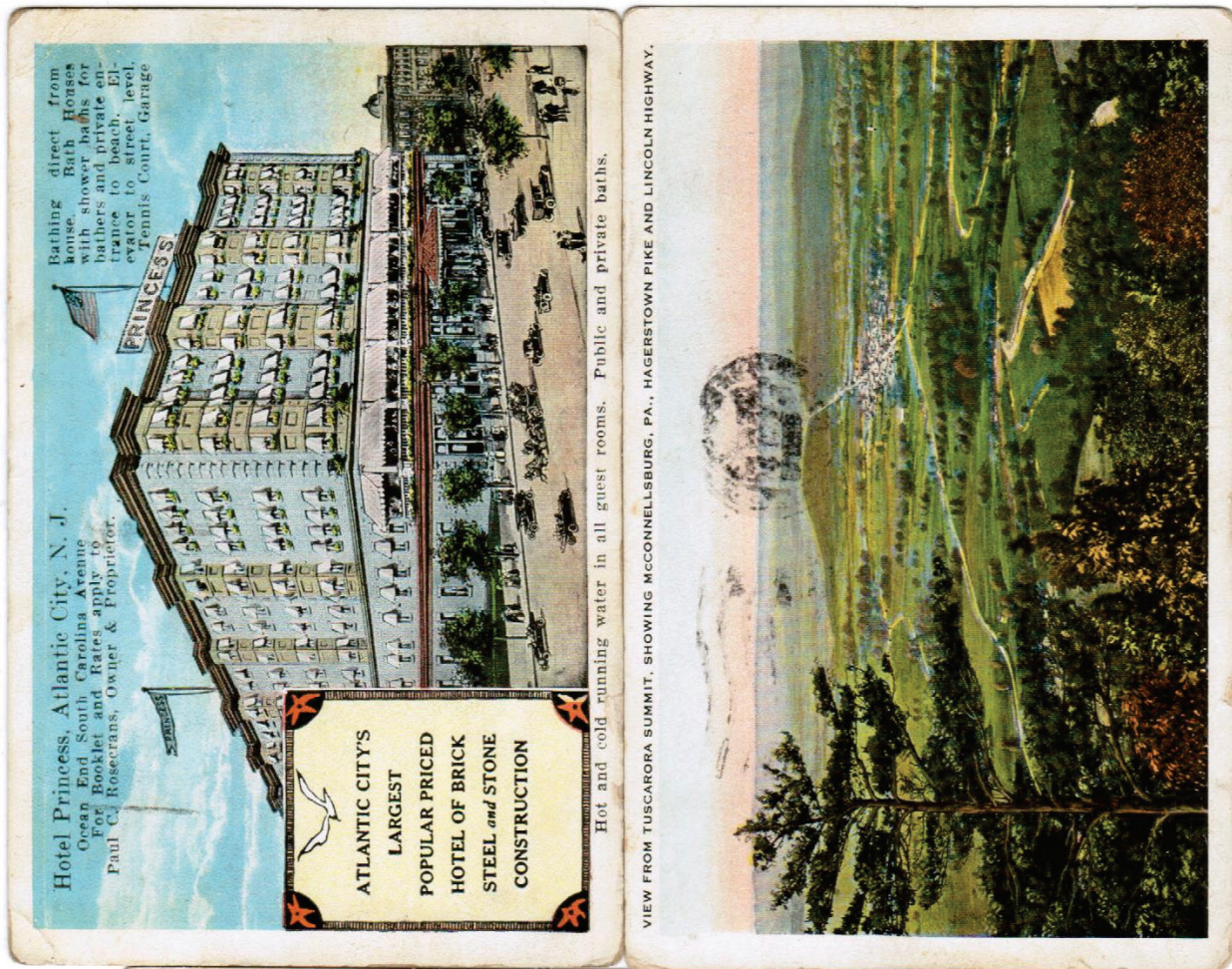




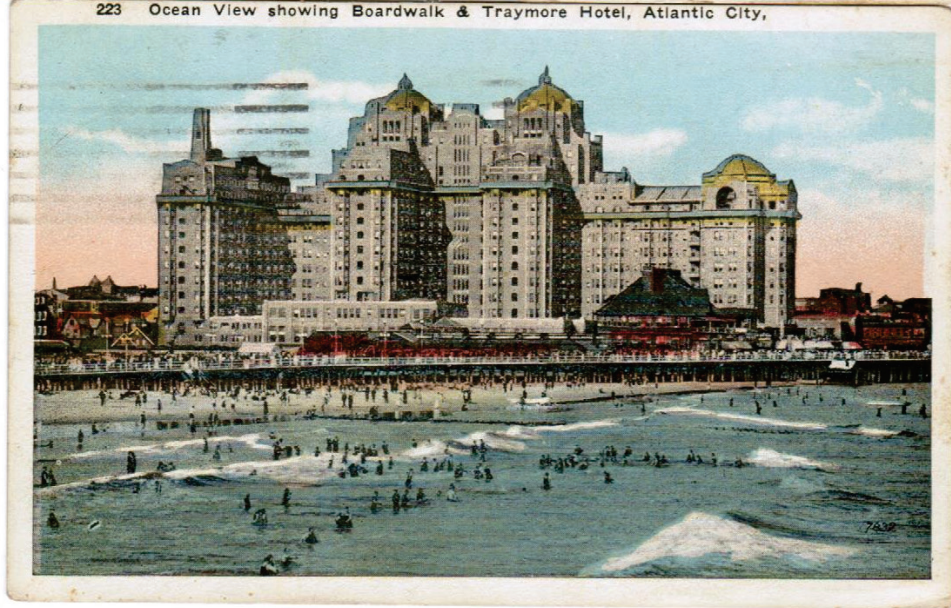

According to Robert (Bobby Clyde), Bob Sr. had an alcoholic as a father. Bob Sr. couldn't finish school because there wasn't enough money. Bob Sr. worked in a steel mill in Franklin: third ward where the new immigrants settled – mainly Polish. Bob was a very conscientious person. Someone at Joy Manufacturing recognized this about Bob's character, said there was an opening for a tool-and-die maker at Joy, and told Bob Sr. if you want this job, you need to take a class and be certified by an inspector. And so Bob Sr. became a tool-and-die maker.

Joy Manufacturing was the largest manufacture in Franklin. Joy Mfg. made mining machines – specifically coal mining. Their machines went into the underground coal mines and dug out the coal.

Bob Jr.: When Bob Sr. was in the navy he did some drinking and smoking. Yet at age 23, he married Olive McKelvey – a very strong-minded individual with high moral standards.

Milo: Perhaps, Bob Sr. recognized that he (age 23) needed Olive's approach.

Bob Jr.: "Dad did not want to leave his secure job with Joy Manufacturing and move to Waverly Iowa in 1947 to work with a new startup business. Mom was very devout Christian. She told Bob Sr., "God has told me – in prayer – that we should make this move." Yet, this worked out to be the best thing that ever happened to our family."

Eileen was 12 when Bobby Clyde was born. When Eileen left Franklin in 1935 to go to Anderson, Bobby Clyde was five. Thus, there wasn't much overlap.
