Young adults more likely to live with parents

In 2001, 57% of young men and women aged 20 to 24 were living with their parents;

In 1981, the proportion was only 41%.

Generally speaking, young adults who live with their parents are much more likely to be single, to attend school full time and to have lower income than young adults who are not living with their parents2.

The Problem

Growing Epidemic of Unmotivated Boys and Underachieving Young Men.

Something scary is happening to boys today. From kindergarten to college, American boys are, on average, less resilient and less ambitious than they were a mere twenty years ago. The gender gap in college attendance and graduation rates has widened dramatically.

Fully one-third of men ages 22-34 are still living at home with their parents about a 100 percent increase in the past twenty years.

Boys nationwide are increasingly dropping out of school; fewer are going to college.

Boys vs. Girls Why?

Boys are four to six times more likely than girls to commit suicide.1

Boys are four to ten times more likely to be diagnosed with a serious emotional disorder. 1

One out of every four males in America has an arrest record. 2

Among the recent epidemic of high-profile school killings, all but one incident was perpetrated by boys.

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
Young Men Living At Home Are More Violent


